



Bol d'OR Internal Rules

Preliminaries:

Terminology used in these Internal Rules.

Circuit Area:

The sporting grounds includes the track and sports facilities required to hold this type of event (building, parking, paddock, stands, slope, etc.), and any other structures and spaces allowing the events to be attended by spectators, the public to be greeted and the events controlled by the organiser.

Organiser:

Any natural or legal person responsible for organising the Bol d'Or event, which takes place over 4 days, from Thursday 15 to Sunday, September 18, 2016, and is open to the public. This includes: AMCF club, AMCF SPORT and Editions LARIVIERE and any other entity or contractor subcontracted or approved by them, as well as all the volunteers and attendants involved in the running of the event.

Manager:

Any natural or legal person responsible for the operation of the infrastructures located inside the sporting ground of the Paul Ricard circuit and infrastructure located around the circuit to accommodate the public, Castellet Airport in particular.

Outdoor spaces:

Any natural or legal person responsible for the operation of the infrastructure located around the circuit to accommodate the public, Castellet Airport in particular.

Public:

All persons entering the Bol d'Or grounds.

Bol d'Or Grounds:

Includes the sporting grounds and outdoor spaces.

TITLE I: ACCESS TO THE BOL D'OR

Article 1: Restricted Access

The provisions set forth in these Internal Rules shall apply both within the Bol d'Or grounds and also in spaces made available to the public by the event organiser and manager, to any individual or group travelling on foot or in a vehicle.

Article 2: Access restrictions and control

Access to certain areas within the Bol d'Or grounds is subject to a fee. An access card is then issued and sold at the current price.

Spot checks can be carried out within these spaces and the access cards must be presented at any time.

Every spectator, regardless of age, must have an access card granting access to the spaces listed on said "access card".

Anyone in possession of an access card corresponding to a reduced or adjusted price must be able to prove this under pain of being refused entry to the circuit.

Access to the track and the specific areas is closed to the public and to any person not expressly authorised.

Article 3: Current regulations

All persons entering the Bol d'Or grounds must comply with these rules and the laws and regulations in force, see next article.

Article 4: Schedules

The Bol d'Or grounds are open during the times displayed at the main entrance.

Article 5: Specific access areas

Access to certain areas in the Bol d'Or reception areas are regulated.

The spaces, meeting and seminar rooms, press and media rooms, public relations areas, lodges, stands, paddocks, track, areas reserved for officials, technical areas and commercial and fairground areas may only be accessed by persons holding a special entry permit.

Checks may be carried out at the entrance or in those areas in accordance with Article 2.

Article 6: Control

The public and any individual in general and regardless of age, must submit to the checks performed at the entrances and inside the Bol d'Or grounds.

The public must submit to any security pat-downs required by the Bol d'Or control and security services.

Any person may be required to present all items that he may be carrying, whether contained in their clothing or hand luggage, as well as permit a search thereof.

Anyone who refuses to submit to these control measures will be refused entry to the Bol d'Or grounds.

Article 7: Vehicle and bag searches

All vehicles will be searched in order to be able to access the Bol d'Or grounds.

The content of the vehicles will also be inspected by security guards provided for this purpose. Each driver will be responsible for the entire content of the vehicle so that the search is made easier for security staff.

Anyone who refuses to submit to these searches will be refused entry to the Bol d'Or grounds or be removed.

In case of removal, no refund can be claimed in the event that the access cards were purchased in advance.

Article 8: Limited and regulated access

With the exception of the participants in the competition, the Bol d'Or staff, guests and spectators staying at the Concentration 3 stars, access to the Circuit Paul Ricard will be exclusively on foot. No public motorcycle are allowed to circulate inside the circuit.

Spectators staying at the concentration campsite will be invited, after passing the checkpoints located at the main entrance, to go to the concentration area to park their motorcycles. Only motorcycles are allowed. No vehicle with 3 or 4 wheels may be parked in the concentration campsite or outside.

Spectators of the MCTBO will be able to access their space through the main entrance, after being searched by the MCTBO staff. The MCTBO concentration campsite shall be subject to the same constraints, restrictions and regulations.

Bol d'Or spectators, after searches are conducted, will be directed to the Pinède campsite or to the daily parking area based on the ticket purchased parking.

Spectators will gain access into the Castellet circuit grounds on foot. Any contraband will be seized and disposed of at the entrance to the sports area and no spectator shall be allowed to enter the sporting grounds with a tent.

Only "Concentration 3 étoiles" ticket holders' may camp in the Circuit Paul Ricard.

Only MCTBO spectators may camp in the airport area and on the runway.

Camping is prohibited in the daily parking areas.

Article 9: Regulation

In accordance with the French Sports Code, perpetrators of disturbances of public order on the Bol d'Or grounds, including during the course of a sporting event, shall be subject to the following sanctions:

Pursuant to Article L323-4 of the French Sports Code,

No person may bring or attempt to bring alcoholic beverages into a sporting ground, or during the course of the public broadcast of a sporting event, on pain of a €500 fine and one year imprisonment.

Pursuant to Article L332-4 of the French Sports Code,

No intoxicated person may access a sporting ground during the course of a sporting event or the public broadcast thereof.

The fact that the perpetrator of this offence may commit acts of violence that causes a total inability to work for a period of up to eight days is punishable by a fine of €15,000 and one year imprisonment.

Pursuant to Article L332-5 of the French Sports Code,

No intoxicated person may enter or attempt to enter, by force or fraud, a sporting ground during the course of a sporting event or the public broadcast thereof, on pain of a fine of €15,000 and one year imprisonment.

Pursuant to Article L332-6 of the French Sports Code,

Spectators may not incite hatred or violence towards the referee, a sports judge, a player or any other person or group of people during the course of a sporting event or the public broadcast thereof, on pain of a fine of €15,000 and one year imprisonment.

Pursuant to Article L332-7 of the French Sports Code,

No person may bring, wear or display in a sporting ground, during the course of a sporting event or the public broadcast thereof, insignia, signs or symbols evoking a racist or xenophobic ideology, on pain of a fine of €15,000 and one year imprisonment.

Pursuant to Article L332-8 of the French Sports Code,

No person may bring, hold or make use of flares or fireworks of any kind, or bring, without just cause, all items that may constitute a weapon within the meaning of Article L132675 of the French Criminal Code in a sporting ground, during the course of a sporting event or the public broadcast thereof, on pain of a fine of €15,000 and 3 years' imprisonment.

Pursuant to Article L332- 9 of the French Sports Code,

No person may throw in a sporting ground, during the course of a sporting event or the public broadcast thereof, a projectile presenting a danger to public safety, on pain of a fine of €15,000 and 3 years' imprisonment.

Pursuant to Article L332-10 of the French Sports Code,

No person may disturb the course of the competition or endanger the safety of persons or property by entering the competition area of a sporting ground, on pain of a fine of €15,000 and 1 year imprisonment.

The administrative measures are: In respect of the individual measures,

- Article L332-16 of the French Sports Code gives the Prefect the power to pronounce, by order, an administrative ban on access to sporting grounds which can be accompanied by an obligation to check-in at such time when the sporting event whose access is denied takes place. This penalty applies to offences committed in and around a sporting ground but also those committed outside these sports events (during travel or at public support rallies or in city centres).
- Law No. 2011-267 of 14 March 2011 strengthens the Prefect's powers. It gives the Prefect the ability to pronounce the ban for up to 12 months. This period may be extended to 24 months if the person concerned has already been the subject of a stadium ban during the previous 3 years. The stadium ban can now be justified by membership in a dissolved or suspended association.
- According to Law 2000-321 of 12 April 2000 on the rights of citizens in their relations with the authorities, this measure is imposed after a period during which the alleged offender is invited to submit his or her arguments.
- Non-compliance with these measures is immediately reported to the Public Prosecutor who will order a criminal investigation, following which the criminal court, if the facts constitute a criminal act, may impose a fine of €3,750 and/or one year imprisonment.

In respect of the collective measures,

In addition to these individual measures, Article L332-18 of the French Sports Code provides for the pronouncement of the suspension of activities or the dissolution of any association or de facto grouping of supporters of fact whose members have committed to meeting in relation or in connection with a sports event, acts of violence or incitement to hatred or discrimination.

Criminal sanctions,

In addition to the penalties provided for breaches of the Penal Code (offence to public officials during the exercise of their duties, rebellion, incitement to violence...) the French Sports Code provides for specific offences.

Along with these sanctions, the court may impose an additional penalty of prohibition to enter or go near grounds where a sporting event is held, lasting up to 5 years, with, possibly, a check-in obligation.

Violating this legal prohibition may result in a €30,000 fine and 2 years' imprisonment.

For all criminal offences described, the Public Prosecutor will systematically conduct a criminal investigation and if violations constitute a criminal act, will bring the perpetrators before the criminal court, particularly in the context of accelerated procedures for immediate appearance.

TITLE II: PROHIBITED ACTS IN BOL D'OR

Article 10: Specific prohibitions in BOL d'OR sporting events

FIRE IS PROHIBITED

Lighting fires inside the Bol d'Or grounds is also prohibited. Any device generating flames or sparks and which may cause a fire or fire risk is strictly prohibited inside the Bol d'Or grounds.

The introduction of any explosive, flammable or volatile product, any pyrotechnic composition or product and glass packaging is strictly prohibited inside the Bol d'Or ground.

The organiser reserves the right to ban any device inside the Bol d'Or if it poses a threat to safety.

Article 11: Prohibited items

Prohibited items are:

- All dangerous objects: knives, tools, glassware, other than helmets for on-road motorcycling, rigid and large diameter flagstaff, metal bars and cans, plastic bottles with caps...
- All pyrotechnic and explosive materials, (sparklers, torches, Bengal lights, firecrackers, smoke bombs, rockets...)
- Alcoholic beverages;
- Banners, badges or other media used for political, ideological, philosophical or commercial purpose, especially those of a racist or xenophobic character.

In addition, access to the Bol d'Or ground is not allowed to holders of sharp or blunt objects and, in general, bulky or dangerous objects.

In general, the public is asked to avoid provoking, by his attitude, dress, or words, any disorder whatsoever to the smooth running of the events attended or to the sporting ground and outdoor spaces and to comply with safety instructions.

Violators may be removed from the Bol d'Or grounds with no claim to a refund of any kind.

In case of a repeated offence, the organiser or the manager reserves the right to take legal action for permanent exclusion notwithstanding the application of any of the provisions of Article L.332-11 of the French Sports Code.

Article 12: Barbecues are prohibited.

Given the prohibition of fire and the prohibition to bring in a generator of flame, barbecuing is strictly prohibited except with an electric grill powered by a small individual generator.

Article 13: Various prohibitions.

The following is strictly forbidden Inside the Bol d'Or grounds:

- Crossing the devices used to contain the public and, except in case of emergency, using the emergency exits;
- Crossing fences and roadblocks, contravening displayed prohibitions;
- Engaging in racing, rushing, sliding or climbing;
- Throwing papers or trash and in particular, chewing gum on the ground;
- Using a sling-shot, throwing various objects, climbing over fences, seats or walls;
- Engaging, without prior authorisation, in any business, advertising or propaganda, conducting surveys, distributing or sell leaflets, printed materials, newspapers, badges, substances or objects of any kind;
- Disturbing others by any noisy demonstrations, including listening to music devices and the use of musical instruments, except during events, subject to authorisation for the same;
- Using spaces and equipment in a manner that is not in accordance with their intended manner;
- Holding any event and spectacle whatsoever without obtaining the authorization;
- Conducting any tour without obtaining permission from the organiser;
- Damaging the furniture set up inside or outside the Bol d'Or grounds;
- Bringing in animals, even if leashed, inside the Bol d'Or grounds. Generally, animals, even when leashed, may not enter the Bol d'Or grounds;
- Circulating inside the Bol d'Or grounds without clothing.

Interruption of the race by the occupation or presence of the public on the track and on safety outskirts (safety paths, etc.) is strictly forbidden.

Article 14: Defacing

Affixing of graffiti, posters, marks or stains on walls, gates, buildings and on trees and on all works is prohibited.

Any person who is caught intentionally defacing or damaging the movable and immovable property of the Bol d'Or grounds (removing seats, breaking of windows, tags etc.) or who threatens the safety of people including through the use of explosives, incendiary or pyrotechnic substances shall be immediately handed over to the police.

Any person prosecuted under these facts shall, firstly, be subject to a fine whose amount is between 3,750 and 75,000 euros and also a penalty of 5 years imprisonment pursuant to Articles 332-1 to 332-4 of the French Penal Code; added to these penalties will be the reimbursement of the costs of remediation work caused by the damage.

Article 15: Destruction and degradation.

To ensure the safety of the premises, the following is prohibited:

- Damaging flower beds, pulling or taking plants and in particular the circuit laurels, picking flowers, breaking or cutting the foliage, mutilating and climbing trees;
- Entering the forest of trees or shrubs or crossing through them;
- In general, committing any action likely to cause degradation.

Literal wording of Article 322-1 of the Criminal Code: "The destruction, degradation or deterioration of property belonging to another person is punishable by 2 years' imprisonment and a fine of 30,000 euros. "

Article 16: Games, exercises or practices

Exercises or games with a risk of personal injury or damage to equipment, as well as any activity that may impede traffic and disturb the peace of the place is prohibited.
Card games or games of chance, accompanied by stakes, are not allowed.
Ball and football games are also prohibited.

Article 17: Bol d'Or Staff

In the general interest, the public must comply with the recommendations or injunctions given to them by Bol d'Or staff.
The public must respect the defined areas and follow the directions given by Bol d'Or staff.

TITLE III: Vehicle access to the Bol d'Or grounds

Article 18: Vehicle access

It is hereby recalled that the wearing of motorcycle helmets is mandatory for all movements within the Bol d'Or grounds.
The Highway Code applies to any dispute concerning movement within the Bol d'Or grounds.

Motorised or non-motorised scooters, skateboards or motorized land vehicle may not be used inside the Bol d'Or grounds, unless authorised by the organiser or the circuit manager. In particular 2-wheel devices called "Pocket Bike" and in general any device deemed dangerous for public safety are forbidden inside the Bol d'Or grounds.

In case of fraudulent introduction, the objects will be seized and confiscated and discarded immediately.

Vehicle access inside the Bol d'Or grounds is regulated during the course of the Bol d'Or sporting event. The foregoing is allowed, subject to the allocation of a traffic and parking card issued by the organiser or the circuit manager. The traffic or parking card must be prominently displayed on the vehicle.

The traffic or parking card is linked to a vehicle and a licence plate number; it cannot be assigned or loaned under pain of forfeiture.

Article 19: Regulated speed and vehicle insurance

The provisions of the Highway Code shall apply inside the Bol d'Or grounds. Drivers are required to comply with and obey the signs under pain of exclusion.

Vehicles must circulate at very low speed in order to be able to come to an immediate stop in all circumstances. Drivers must respect the imposed maximum speed set at 30 km/hr unless indicated otherwise as displayed on any signalling.

Drivers are required to use traffic lanes only and travel in the direction of traffic.

Vehicles travelling inside the Bol d'Or grounds must be insured and comply with the technical control according to the year. The insurance certificates and technical checks must be displayed on pain of exclusion.

Article 20: Parking

Parking of vehicles is regulated and authorised to vehicles with a parking ticket issued by the organiser or manager. The parking card must be prominently displayed on the vehicle.

Drivers must use the locations provided for this purpose in the parking areas and obey the injunctions of control and security service staff. When parking outside of designated areas or in undesignated areas, the vehicle is subject to a removal and is impounded. Upon recovery of the vehicle, the driver will be required to pay a sum of money as part of the organisational costs in the amount indicated on the back of the traffic or parking card.

Article 21: Objects in vehicles

It is recommended that objects be left in vehicle when these can be seen from outside of the vehicle. The organiser or manager shall not be held responsible for theft or damage.

Article 22: Fire fighter Access and Exits

For security reasons, parking in front of the accesses, entrances, exits, dry risers, hydrants and evacuation stairs is forbidden. Climbing the railings or fences surrounding the entire sporting ground and outdoor spaces is prohibited. The act of entering the track is punished by a fine of 15,000 euros and a year in prison (Article L.332-10 of the French Sports Code).

Accordingly, any offender will be handed over to law enforcement.

PART IV: Image rights, filming and recordings

Article 23: Image rights

The public is informed that the events are likely to be filmed as part of TV broadcasts, movies and internet. Any ticket holder consequently authorises the organiser or manager to use images in which s/he might appear, taken during events, on all media including documents that they could edit to carry out their promotion and advertising and the re-broadcast of the event, anywhere in the world, without limitation as to time or quantity.

Article 24 Filming and recordings

Filming and sound recordings can only be made in the sporting ground and the outdoor areas with express authorisation from the organiser or manager or persons authorised by the same to issue such authorisation.

Similarly, the technical facilities or equipment cannot be photographed, filmed or recorded without such authorisation. Some freedom is given to amateurs, the organiser or manager however reserving the right to prohibit filming and recording of any kind in certain areas or during certain events that it so specifically designates.

TITLE V - Application of the Internal Rules

Article 25: Abnormal conduct

The public must refrain from any act likely to endanger the safety of staff and third parties.

Any accident or abnormal event must be immediately reported to a staff member.

Article 26: Evacuation from the Site

If evacuation from the Bol d'Or grounds has become necessary, the public will be directed by the staff present. The evacuation will be coordinated by "queue guides" and "queue leaders" identifiable by a "Reception and Control" pinafore. All persons shall be required to comply with the safety instructions given by the staff in charge of operations.

Article 27: Lost and found

The objects should be handed to a member of staff in charge of reception and control or a security officer located at the access points. They are made available to the owner for a period of thirty days, at the main reception located at the entrance of the Circuit Paul Ricard. After this period, they will be discarded.

Article 28: Alerts

In any situation likely to endanger the safety of persons and property inside the Bol d'Or grounds, alert arrangements can be made, especially in the event of closure of access points and control of exits.

Article 29: Total or partial closure

In the event of excessive crowds, disturbances, strikes and any situation likely to endanger the safety of persons and property, the total or partial closure of the Bol d'Or grounds may be implemented as well as entry controls by all appropriate means. The head of control and security will take any measures imposed by the circumstances, including the establishment of inspections of any luggage, bag, parcel or package at the entrance to the Bol d'Or grounds.

Article 30: Amendments to the Internal Rules

The organizer reserves the right to modify all or part of these Internal Rules at any time for legitimate reasons, including, without limitation, for reasons of security, to improve the service or to take into account legislative or regulatory developments.

Article 31: Penalty for breach of the Internal Rules

Any violation of any of the rules set forth herein shall result in the immediate removal of the person concerned and, where appropriate, prosecution. Ticket refunds will not be issued in any case.
